



Student Support for Concerns, Grievances, Complaints

- Students may submit faculty and/or advising concerns through a form on our website <u>Grievance Forms</u>
- Grade appeals policy
 - Meet with student to try to resolve, if not student may appeal in writing through the area chair
- Student disclosure of sexual misconduct
 - Faculty are responsible employees, requiring reports
 of prohibited conduct to be made to the University Title IX Coordinator

Registration/Class Schedule

- Registration
 - Undergraduates register themselves
 - Graduate Academic Services registers students for select graduate core courses. Otherwise graduate students register themselves.
- Academic Services handles exceptions (e.g., force-adds, prerequisite overrides)
- Class schedules check your classroom
- Ad hoc room requests

 - Graduate programs administration dates differ from undergraduate. An email is sent to faculty teaching to remind them.



Synchronous

Use Class Time

Set time aside in the beginning of the final class to let students complete the surveys

Communicate

Teach students the importance of course evaluations: students' voices are heard, feedback is important for success, and evaluations are an essential part of the dialogue with students.

Compete

Share the response rate from other sections to encourage friendly competition

Asynchronous

<u>Update Students</u>

Send students the current response rate daily to show their collective progress

Send Reminders

Post Blackboard announcements or send email reminders about the survey

Communicate

Teach students the importance of course evaluations: students' voices are heard, feedback is important for success, and evaluations are an essential part of the dialogue with students.

- If you require Microsoft software for class, CCB provides free downloads. Students who need VMWare no longer need to request a license from CCB IT. Please delete busmsdn@gmu.edu references from your syllabus. (We will keep this account open and send the new instructions to students who may have missed the updates.)
- For Windows students, they will continue to go to the free Azure site to download their Windows apps.
- For Mac students, they may either download VMWare freely and without a license, install a VM, and download Windows software from the site above <u>OR</u> they can access Mason's Citrix Virtual Lab and access the software there.
